

accident(ally)	- something bad that was not meant to happen (accident: noun, accidentally: adverb)
actual(ly)	- real or a fact (adjective)
address	- a place where someone lives or where a building is located (noun)
answer	- a reply to a question (noun) - to write or speak in response to a question (verb)
appear	- to come into sight or to become aware of something (verb)
arrive	- to reach a place at the end of a journey (verb)
believe	- to have an opinion, or to think something (verb)
bicycle	- a vehicle with two wheels, powered by pedals (bike) (noun)
breath	- the air taken into, and breathed out of, the body through the lungs (noun)
breathe	- to take air in and out of the lungs (verb)
build	- to create or construct something (verb)
busy/business	- having a lot of things to deal with (adjective): business - the practice of making a living through working for, or owning a trade (e.g, a shop) (noun)
calendar	- a chart to show the days and months of a particular year (noun)
caught	- the <i>past tense</i> of the verb 'to catch' (verb)
centre	- the middle of something (noun)
century	- a period of 100 years (noun)
certain	- something that is known for sure (adjective)
circle	- a round shape (noun)
complete	- something that is finished (adjective or verb)
consider	- to think carefully (verb)
continue	- to keep going (verb)
decide	- to make a decision about something (verb)
describe	- to explain what something is like (verb)
different	- not the same as another (adjective)
difficult	- very hard/ not easy (adjective)
disappear	- something that can no longer be seen or found (verb)
early	- something that happens before the expected time (adjective or adverb)
earth	- the planet on which we live (noun)
eight/eighth	- the number 8 (8: noun)
enough	- a word describe 'no more' (adverb)

exercise	- an activity requiring effort, in order to improve health and fitness (noun or verb)
experience	- something that has been done before (so that a person has knowledge of what something is like) (noun)
experiment	- a scientific test to make a discovery, test an idea, or demonstrate a known fact (noun or verb)
extreme	- reaching a high, or highest amount (adjective)
famous	- some thing or person that is well-known (adjective)
favourite	- the thing that you like best (adjective)
February	- second month of the year (noun)
forward(s)	- to travel or look in the direction you are facing (adverb)
fruit	- the sweet and fleshy part of a tree (or plant) that can be eaten as food; e.g, apple, banana, strawberry) (noun)
grammar	- the study of words (and how they make sense when used in sentences) (noun)
group	- a number of people or things that are together (noun)
guard	- to protect (noun or verb) guard (noun): The guard kept watch over the prisoner. guard (verb): Guard it with your life!
guide	- to show the way (noun or verb) guide (noun): The visitors followed the guide around the museum. guide (verb): I will guide you to the nearest hotel.
heard	- <i>past tense</i> of the verb 'to hear' (verb)
heart	- a muscle that pumps blood around the body (noun)
height	- how high/ tall something is (noun)
history	- the study of things that have happened in the past (noun)
imagine	- to think of something (verb)
increase	- to make bigger or greater (verb)
important	- something that <i>really</i> matters (adjective)
interest	- wanting to know or learn about something or someone (noun)
island	- a piece of land surrounded by water (noun)
knowledge	- something that a person knows (noun)
learn	- to find out more about something (verb)
length	- how long something is (noun)
library	- a place where books are kept (noun)
material	- what something is made from (e.g; wood, plastic, metal) (noun)

medicine	- a scientific product to help with illness (noun)
mention	- to quickly talk about something (verb)
minute	- a period of 60 seconds (noun)
natural	- something that grows or exists in nature (is not man-made) (adjective)
naughty	- bad behaviour (adjective)
notice	to become aware of something (noun or verb) notice (noun): A notice was put up telling people to keep out. notice (verb): Did anyone notice that noise?
occasion(ally)	- something that only happens sometimes (occasion: noun, occasionally: adverb)
often	- something that happens a lot (adjective)
opposite	- a person or thing that is totally different from or the reverse of someone or something else (adjective)
ordinary	- something that is not special or memorable (adjective)
particular	- a word used to single out a specific person, group or object (adjective)
peculiar	- strange/ odd (adjective)
perhaps	- a word to describe 'maybe' or 'possibly' (adjective)
popular	- something that is well-liked (by a lot of people) (adjective)
position	- a place where someone or something is located or has been put (noun)
possess(ion)	- to own something (possess: verb, possession: noun)
possible	- when something is able to be done (adjective)
potatoes	- plural of 'potato' a vegetable (noun)
pressure	- a force put on, or against, an object (noun)
probably	- almost certainly (but not quite definite) (adverb)
promise	- to say that a person will do something (noun or verb) promise (noun): I will make you a promise. promise (verb): I promise that I won't tell anyone.
purpose	- the reason for which something is being done (noun)
quarter	- something is divided into four equal parts (noun)
question	- to ask for information (noun or verb) question (noun): Can I ask you a question? question (verb): The police officer wanted to question the suspect.
recent	- something that happened a short time ago (adjective)
regular	- something that happens a lot (adjective)

reign	- the length of time a king or queen rules (noun)
remember	- to not forget (verb)
sentence	- a set of words to give separate information (noun)
separate	- to be apart (adjective or verb) separate (adjective): The children sat at separate tables. separate (verb): I'm going to have to separate you.
special	- better, greater, or otherwise different from what is usual (adjective)
straight	- to move directly somewhere without curves or bends (adjective or adverb) straight (adjective): They travelled on a straight road. straight (adverb): I'm so tired I can hardly think straight.
strange	- weird/ odd (adjective)
strength	- how strong something is (noun)
suppose	- to use knowledge or experience to think something might be the case (but not certain) (verb)
surprise	- something that is unexpected (noun or verb) surprise (noun): That was a lovely surprise. surprise (verb): I'm going to surprise you.
therefore	- a word similar in meaning to 'so' and 'then' (adverb)
though/although	- a word similar in meaning to 'but' (adverb)
thought	- past tense of the verb 'to think' (verb or noun) thought (verb): She thought carefully about her work. thought (noun): They suddenly had a fantastic thought.
through	- to move from one place to another, often by having to travel inside something (e.g, a tunnel, a doorway, a classroom) (preposition)
various	- more than one (adjective)
weight	- how heavy something is (noun)
woman/women	- an adult female (women - plural)
