Summer Reading Challenge

A few weeks ago, we had the school library service come in to deliver an assembly on this year's summer reading challenge – 'The Story Garden' this will be starting on the Saturday July 5th and run throughout the summer. Children who complete the challenge – reading 6 library books, will receive a certificate and a medal that will be given out in our Friday Assembly early in the Autumn Term. 	and you can sign up in any of them. Our nearest Library is near the Princess Theatre in Burnham on Sea.

It is required to be undertaken every 3 years.</p> <p>Hall Caretaker - will keep the hall in a clean condition for its various users and will liaise with the lettings manager to provide a good experience for all hall users. Ability to use standard cleaning equipment and chemicals is required. All equipment and chemicals will be provided. Occasional weekend visits to the hall may be required. It is expected this role will require 4 hours per week / 16 hours per month. £13 per hour. The lettings manager will be required to stand in for the caretaker during holidays. Some of the booking and administrative work may be done from home. Occasional weekend visits to the hall may be required. Ability to use and keep at home a laptop is required, also ability to use standard cleaning equipment and chemicals. It is expected this role will require 2 to 3 hours per week / 10 hours per month. £13 per hour. 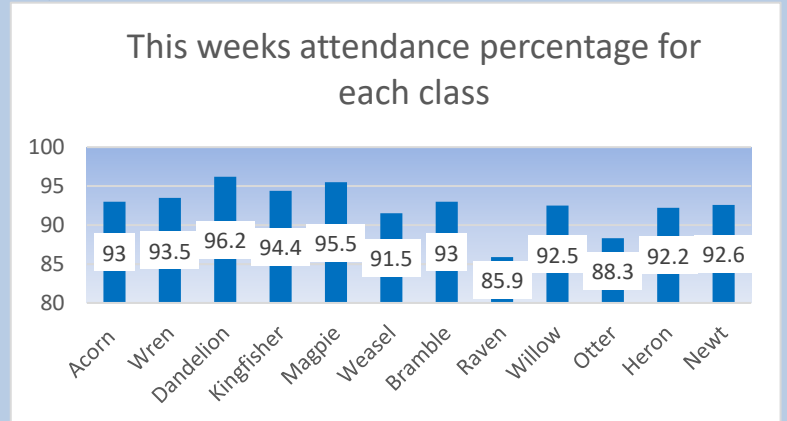

- Missing important instructions for the rest of the school day
- Learning bad habits which could affect their employability in the future

The impact of being just a little late can accumulate to a loss in learning time:

Minutes late per day during the school year	Equals days worth of teaching lost in a year
5 mins	3.4 days
10 mins	6.9 days
15 mins	10.3 days
20 mins	13.8 days
30 mins	20.7 days

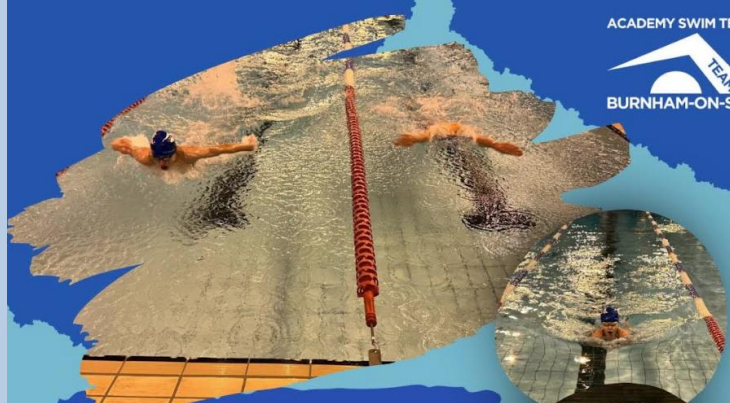

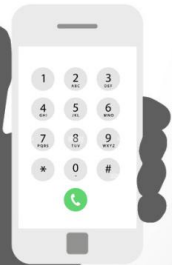
