Year 6 Leavers' Celebrations – Monday 21st July	<p>This year, we are making a small change to our usual format for the Year 6 Leavers' events. On the morning of Monday 21st July, we will begin with a special service at 9:15am in the church, led by Rev Cheryl. This reflective service will include readings, prayers, and a blessing to mark the end of the children's time at St Andrew's.</p> <p>In the afternoon at 2:00pm, we will hold a special Leavers' Assembly in school. Some of the children will share their memories of their time at St Andrew's, there will be songs, and we'll present the Values Awards. We are seeking a caretaker and lettings manager following retirement of the previous long-term incumbent. These are part time roles with flexible working hours. 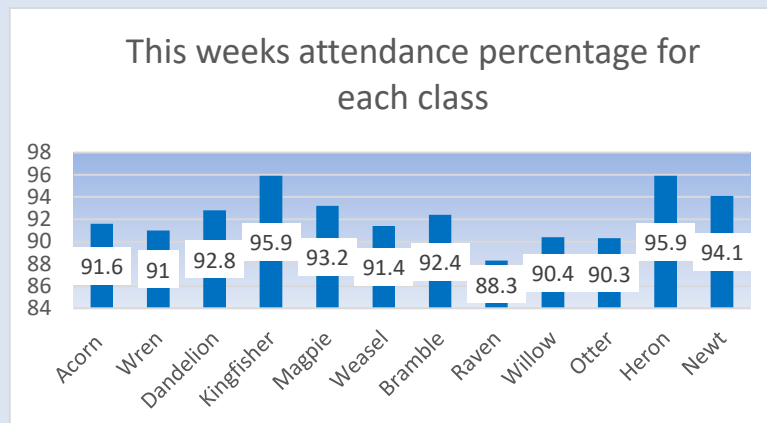

Minutes late per day during the school year	Equals days worth of teaching lost in a year
5 mins	3.4 days
10 mins	6.9 days
15 mins	10.3 days
20 mins	13.8 days
30 mins	20.7 days

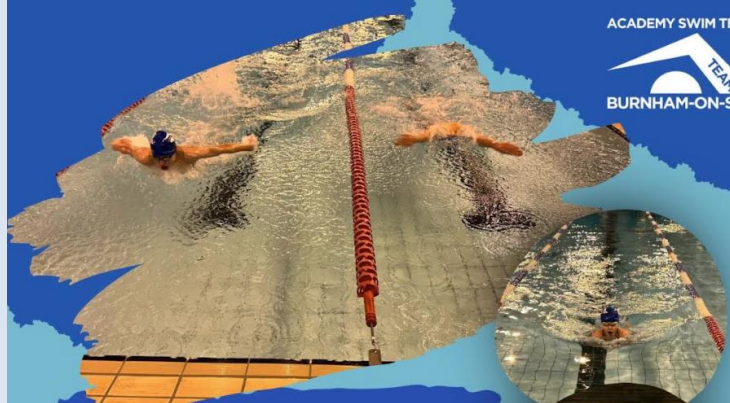

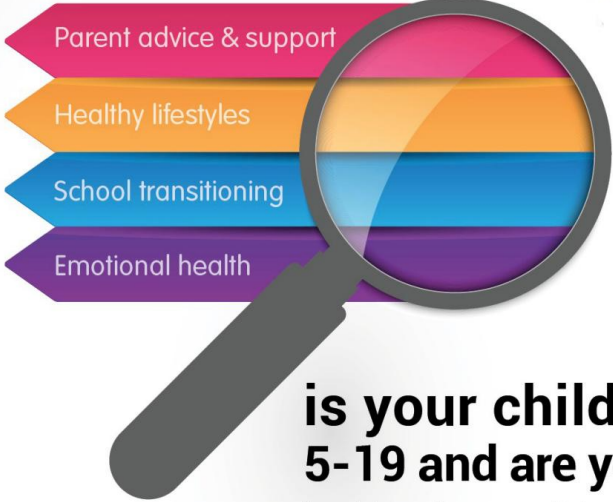
