<b>Class Move up day</b>	<p>On Wednesday 25<sup>th</sup> June we will be having our move up day. This is the day when the children spend time with their new teachers and get to familiarise themselves with their new classroom. <b>Parent Pay</b>	<p>ParentPay 'Live'</p> <p><b>Please activate your child/ren account as we still have 65 pupils that have not been activated.</b> This platform is used for communication including trips as well as payments.</p> <p>We are pleased to let you know that ParentPay is now 'Live'. ParentPay Activation Codes have been sent out by email, from Platform@ParentPay.com. Please activate your account as soon as possible, as consent for trips and payments is through this platform. You can log in to parentpay.com directly. We have been advised that a Single Sign On (SSO) link on Reach More Parents will be available soon.</p> <p>Extended School Provision  Sunrise and Sunset sessions can now be booked through ParentPay. Please note that sessions need to be booked at least 10 days in advance. As places are limited to 14 for Sunrise Club and 16 for Sunset Club. We ask that you make 'block' bookings where possible.</p> <p><u>Childcare Vouchers</u>  Gov.UK Childcare Vouchers can be used to pay for Extended School Provision. Please register using our new URN number 150953 TA81ER and email the reference number for your child to the school office.</p> <p>Please note you need to have credit on your account before you can book any sessions. Therefore, when you make a payment please notify the office of the amount, date and voucher number of your payment so that it can be identified and allocated to your account.</p>
<b>Extended School Provision</b>	<p>We're making it even easier to access our Extended School sessions, as we are changing over to taking the register for sessions online. As long as there is credit on your accounts, you will no longer have to book sessions 10 days in advance, bookings can be made last minute as the system is 'live'.</p> <p>If you have any questions or need help checking your account balance, please contact the school office.</p>

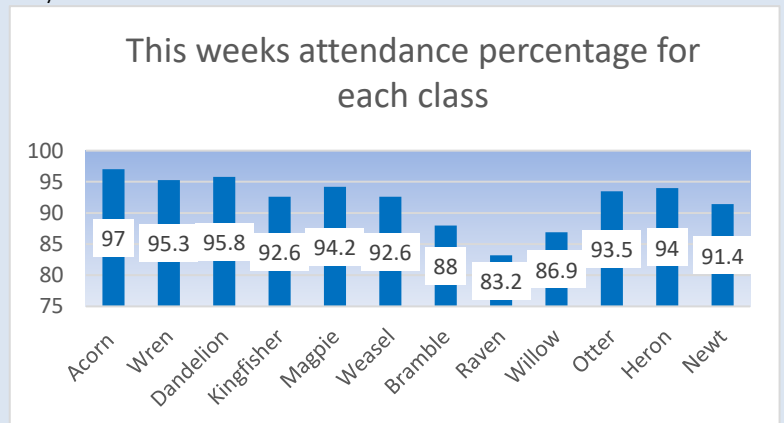

- Missing the beginning of vital lessons making them fall behind
- Missing important instructions for the rest of the school day

- Learning bad habits which could affect their employability in the future

The impact of being just a little late can accumulate to a loss in learning time:

Minutes late per day during the school year	Equals days worth of teaching lost in a year
5 mins	3.4 days
10 mins	6.9 days
15 mins	10.3 days
20 mins	13.8 days
30 mins	20.7 days

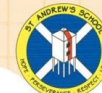

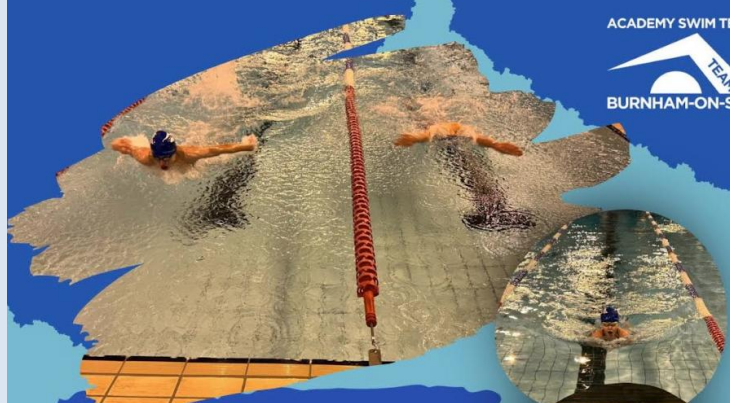

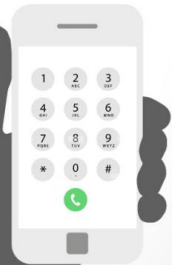
