| Summer Uniform | <p>As we move into the second half of the summer term and with the weather being so lovely it is good to remind you that our summer uniform is as follows:</p> <p>St Andrew’s sweatshirt or cardigan with school logo White shirt or blouse Charcoal (Dark) grey trousers, tailored shorts or culottes Summer dress in blue check Grey or white socks.</p> <p>As children remove their jumpers more often it is important that they are clearly named to help us reunite them when they have been left outside.</p> |
| Scooters and bikes | <p>It’s lovely to see so many children cycling and scooting to school—an active start to the day is always a positive one! However, we kindly ask all parents and carers to ensure that bikes and scooters are not ridden within the school grounds at any time.</p> <p>Please also note that bikes and scooters are not permitted on the school field track. | Parent Pay | <p>ParentPay ‘Live’</p> <p>Please activate your child/ren account as we still have 100 pupils that have not been activated. This platform is used for communication including trips as well as payments.</p> <p>We are pleased to let you know that ParentPay is now ‘Live’. ParentPay Activation Codes have been sent out by email, from Platform@ParentPay.com.</p> <p>Please activate your account as soon as possible, as consent for trips and payments is through this platform.</p> <p>You can log in to parentpay.com directly. We have been advised that a Single Sign On (SSO) link on Reach More Parents will be available soon.</p> <p>Extended School Provision Sunrise and Sunset sessions can now be booked through ParentPay. Please note that sessions need to be booked at least 10 days in advance. As places are limited to 14 for Sunrise Club and 16 for Sunset Club. 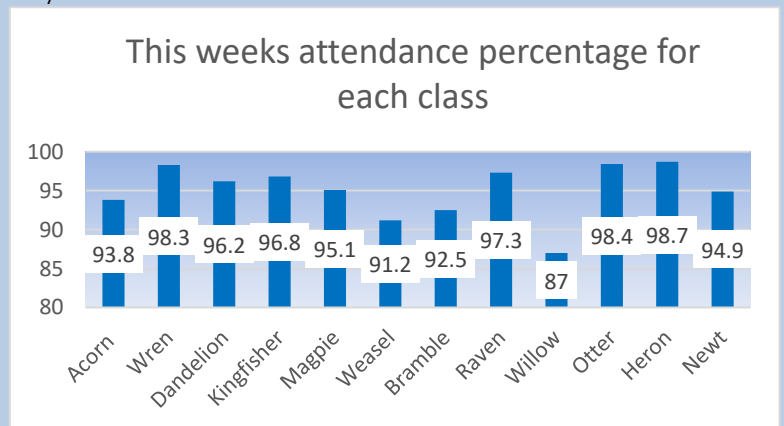

- Learning bad habits which could affect their employability in the future

The impact of being just a little late can accumulate to a loss in learning time:

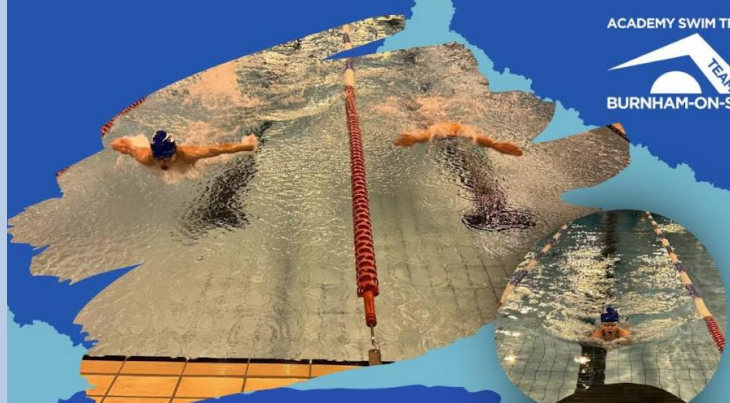

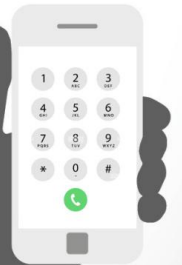
