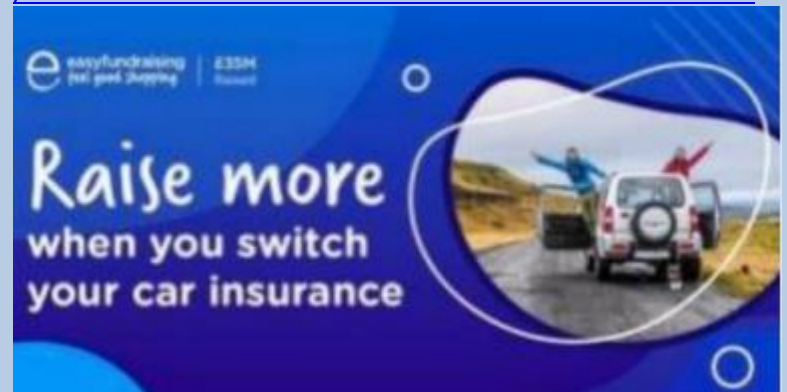
Headteacher Information

Parking and Road Safety Around School

We have received several complaints from local residents regarding parking in permit-only areas and unsafe driving around the school at drop-off and pick-up times. To ensure the safety of all children and to maintain positive relationships with our community, please park responsibly and be mindful of local parking restrictions. We have been in contact with the area Traffic Warden and PCSO, who have agreed to carry out spot

	checks at the start and end of the school day. Thank you for your cooperation in keeping our school community safe.
Smart Watches	Many phones and smart watches now offer internet and e-mail access, alongside standard functions of messaging, camera, video and sound recording. From after half term we will treat Smartwatches as we do mobile phones, so are therefore not permitted to be worn to school, as staff are unable to monitor them closely enough to ensure they are being used appropriately. If your child does wear one to school they will be required to complete a 'Devices in school' form and hand it to the class teacher at the beginning of the day and collect it at the end of the day as they do if they have a mobile phone.

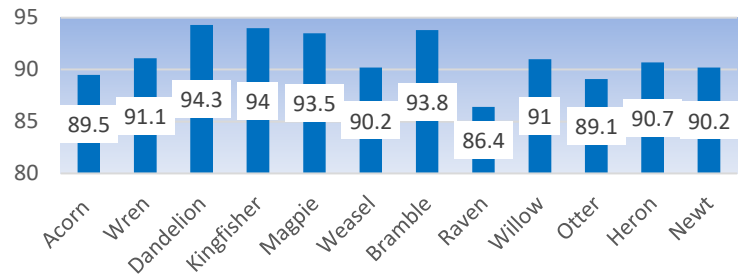

- Learning bad habits which could affect their employability in the future

The impact of being just a little late can accumulate to a loss in learning time:

Minutes late per day during the school year	Equals days worth of teaching lost in a year
5 mins	3.4 days
10 mins	6.9 days
15 mins	10.3 days
20 mins	13.8 days
30 mins	20.7 days

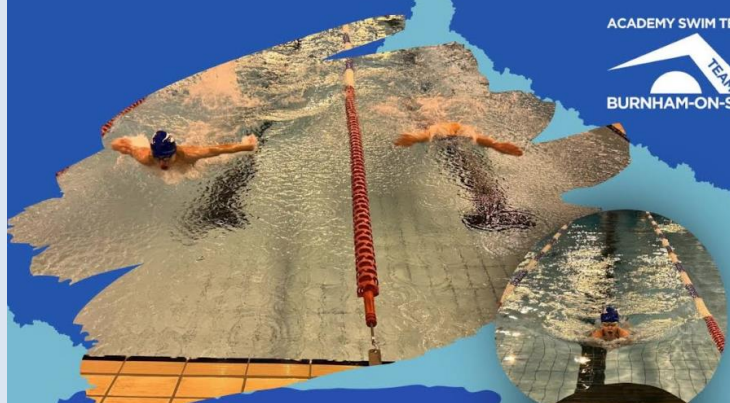

<p>Online safety</p>	<p>Most parents frequently chat with their child about how things are going at school or what’s happening in their friendship groups – but those discussions often do not extend to youngsters’ online activities. In fact, National Online Safety conducted a recent survey which found that only slightly more than half (54%) of parents regularly talk to their children about staying safe online.</p> <p>It can be an awkward topic to broach and, of course, it needs not to feel intrusive. However, just checking in with your child about their digital life can get them thinking about online safety and alert you to any issues they might be having. 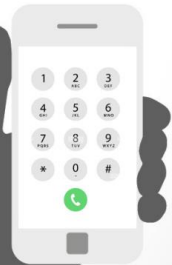
