Headlice/Nits	<p>We are writing to inform you that there have been cases of head lice reported in school. As we head into the weekend, this is a great opportunity to check and treat your child's hair if needed. While lice are nothing more than a nuisance, regular checks are essential to ensure that any head lice are quickly treated before they can spread.</p> <p>How You Can Help:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Check your child's hair once a week using a proper detection comb. • If live lice are found, consult a pharmacist for treatment advice immediately. • Examine the hair of all family members if head lice are spotted. • In many cases, lice and nits can be removed using the wet-combing method. • If your child has long hair, you could keep it tied up or plaited. This might help prevent them from getting head lice because it makes it more difficult for head lice to attach themselves to the bottom of strands of hair which is where they like to live. <p>Wet Combing Instructions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Wash hair with ordinary shampoo. • Apply plenty of conditioner. • Comb the entire head of hair from roots to ends using a fine-toothed detection comb. <p>Detection combs can be purchased from pharmacies or online. If wet combing has not worked or is not suitable, please consult your local pharmacist for alternative treatments.</p> <p>To minimize outbreaks, it's crucial to continue checking for head lice on a regular weekly basis. For further information, speak to your pharmacist or visit https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/head-lice-and-nits/.</p> <p>Thank you for your support in keeping head lice at bay and ensuring the well-being of our school community.</p>

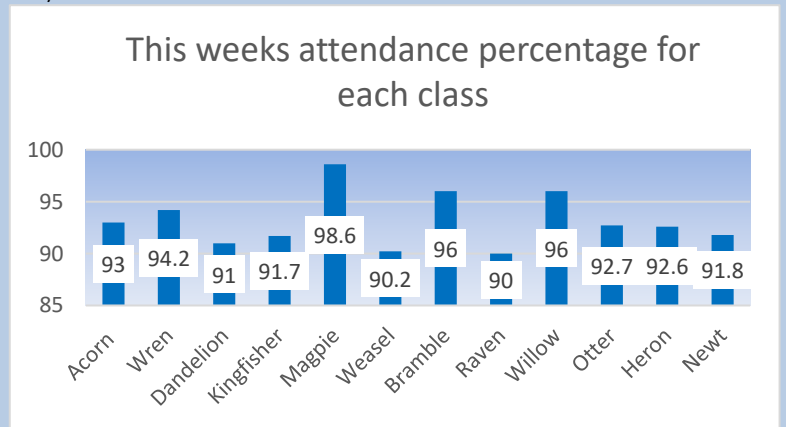

Please remember that being late can lead to your child:

- Feeling embarrassed in front of their friends
- Missing the beginning of vital lessons making them fall behind
- Missing important instructions for the rest of the school day
- Learning bad habits which could affect their employability in the future

The impact of being just a little late can accumulate to a loss in learning time:

Minutes late per day during the school year	Equals days worth of teaching lost in a year
5 mins	3.4 days
10 mins	6.9 days
15 mins	10.3 days
20 mins	13.8 days
30 mins	20.7 days

Online safety

Most of us habitually check our doors are locked each night. We don't leave our cars open with the keys in the ignition. We take care not to let anyone watch us enter our PIN at the cash machine. When it comes to cyber-security, however, many

people aren't anywhere near as routinely cautious – which is one of the reasons that online crime continues to pose a major threat. The UK had the largest percentage of cyber-crime victims per million internet users in 2022; the US had the second-highest ratio. Nations with (relatively) wealthy populations who spent a lot of time online are, therefore, lucrative hunting grounds for cyber criminals. 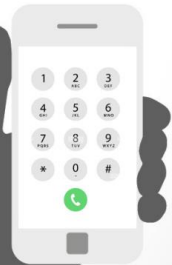
